



Dear Sport&EU members,

The **Sport&EU 19<sup>th</sup> annual conference** will be organised by the **University of Naples Federico II** in Naples, Italy, on **30<sup>th</sup> June and 1<sup>st</sup> July 2025**. The organizing committee is now open to receiving proposals for individual papers.

The deadline to receive proposals is the 31<sup>st</sup> January 2025.

Decisions on accepted papers will be made no later than **17<sup>th</sup> March 2025**.

As each year, the Sport&EU conference strives to have a distinctly multi-disciplinary character. **Papers are invited to cover a wide variety of priority areas**:

1) The three main priorities of the EU Work Plan for Sport 2024-2027:

- integrity and values in sport
- socio-economic and sustainable dimensions of sport
- participation in sport and health-enhancing physical activity
- 2) The recent and current developments of international sport in relation to the following topics:
  - EU Internal Market and Sport
  - Sustainability and Sport
  - Reform perspectives in the following fields:
    - o Sport and audio-visual rights
    - Sport, fundamental rights protection, inclusion
    - The governance and regulation of football and professional sport: Legal and policy routes
    - Professions in the sports industry

3) The traditional Sport&EU topics:

- Legal issues in European sport and the impact on sport of recent rulings of the CJEU
- EU sport policy design and implementation
- Physical activity and physical exercise: EU achievements
- Transgender athletes' inclusion in elite and grassroots sport
- The impact on sport of far right/populism resurgence in Europe
- Opportunities and limits in (European) sport diplomacy (incl. sanctions)

For the 2025 conference delegates will have the opportunity to present two types of papers:

- **Short 10' papers**: floating new ideas, commenting on cases, seeking feedback at early stages of work, etc.
- **Full 20' papers**: More elaborate papers of academic nature, including research objectives, methods, results and discussion.

## Please indicate in your abstract what format you wish to adopt.

Paper proposals (both short and full) will be reviewed by a Scientific Committee of the Sport&EU Association.

Following our traditional policies of equality and diversity, Sport&EU encourages PhD students and young career academics to submit their proposals for this conference. Equally, we especially encourage female and non-binary academics to submit their proposals.

## How to submit your paper:

- Submit a one-page abstract with standard margins (no tables or charts, no bibliography).
- Submit in WORD format, single spaced, using the classical 12-point Arial font.
- Include your full name.
- Include your contact email.
- Please indicate clearly:
  - whether you are proposing a short of full paper;
  - $\circ$  ~ which of the priority topic areas your paper belongs to.
- Each abstract must include the following sections: research objectives/questions, methodology, (preliminary) results and relevance of findings.
- Note that abstracts not following these guidelines will be returned to the authors.

Presenters of accepted full papers may submit a final version for publication in the *Journal of Sports Law, Sports Policy and Sports Diplomacy* (<u>https://hrcak.srce.hr/ojs/index.php/slpdj</u>), which works in partnership with Sport&EU. Another opportunity for publication will be the *International Sport Law Journal* (<u>https://link.springer.com/journal/40318</u>) a peer-reviewed high-level journal, quality-indexed in prominent databases such as Scopus, EBSCO, ProQuest, SCImago etc.
